Guidelines

- 1. The VHS program shall be viewed as an enrichment opportunity for students, not as a replacement for VRHS class offerings.
- 2. Interested students should discuss options with their school counselor and the VHS coordinator. The counselor must approve their students' enrollment.
- 3. Students must agree to all VHS policies posted at thevhscollaborative.org and the Distance Learning Policies of Regional School District 4.
- 4. A parent/guardian must give permission for the student to take the VHS course.
- 5. Registration preference will be given based on seniority, as seat availability is limited.



Students who can work independently and handle responsibility are the best candidates for the VHS program.

Think about whether or not you can manage your time efficiently, why you want to take this VHS course, when you can complete your assignments, and how you believe this will be a different course than your face-to-face classes.

Request to take a VHS course at the same time schedule requests are completed.
